 then let all my just accouants be colleted and honestly
 discharged all this being done I now ordain this as my
 last Will and Testament to be disposed of in the following
 manner. I give to my Sister Mary Blyth chest of drawers
 and my Bed as it stands also the large Table and Chair
 an looking glass an Corner bobert. I give to my Sister Jan-
 net the Boy Bed and furs with 2 pair of blankets an a
 blue stuff cover with 2 sheets an a black silk gown - to my

sister Elizabeth the cloock an 2 pair of fine Blankets to my
 Brother Samuel the Chair an Book case and large Press and 2
 pair of Blankets, the rest of the blankets to my Sister Mary Blyth
 with 2 pair of Sheets, Tablecolthes and Pillow slips and other
 Body colthes to do as she thinks proper with, the watch I give
 to John Gordon son of James Gordon Clackhead as a remembrance
 of his uncles for whom he was called - the Tea spoon I give to
 Isabella Muir as a remembrance of his uncles and Aunt -
 every other little thing my Mother and Mary may do with as
 they think proper and if this is any thing that my Mother
 wishes to have she is to have it for her life time and then
 it may return to the owner - there is also a little lying
 money which I ordain is to be at interest, my Father and
 Mother is to have the yearly interest as long as they live
 with power also to lift a little of it if they have need as
 they are to know no unkindly that as long as any of it
